Dear Elkridge Club Guest,

Welcome Home! The Elkridge Club's staff looks forward to taking care of you! To help prepare you for your visit to the Elkridge, please review the following traditions and courtesies:

Cellular Phones

It is the policy of the Elkridge Club that members limit the usage of electronic devices while on Club grounds. The Club's electronic device policy is as follows:

Electronic devices must be kept on silent or vibrate mode. Electronic devices may NOT be used to make/receive calls or check voicemails unless the member is inside their vehicle with the doors closed, at the Clubhouse inside the Men's or Ladies' locker rooms or at the pool facility inside the Men's or Ladies' locker rooms.

Approved usage at the pool facility (inside the fenced area):

- Texting and emailing
- Reading – (Kindle, Nook, etc.)
- Photographs – taking and viewing
- Checking calendar
- Phone usage – making/receiving calls or checking voicemails **only** while in the locker rooms

Approved usage while on the golf course:

- Texting & emailing – only on holes 2-17, while inside the golf cart, or if walking, in-between holes. Any device usage cannot delay play.
- Range finder
- **NO** phone usage – making/receiving calls or checking voicemails
- **NO** device usage while at the practice facility

Approved usage while at the Clubhouse:

- Photographs – taking or viewing
- Checking calendar
- Phone usage – making/receiving calls or checking voicemails **only while in the locker rooms**
- Texting and emailing - **only while in the locker rooms**

Electronic devices are strictly prohibited from use anywhere else on the Club's campus.

Clubhouse Attire

Casual dress is acceptable at all times in the Clubhouse, except in the Living Room and Main Dining Room where coat and tie for gentlemen and dress or dress slacks for ladies are required. Blue denim attire (jeans, skirts or jackets) is not permitted on Club premises at any time. Hats should never be worn by men inside the Clubhouse, nor when seated on the outdoor porches or terraces.

Golf Attire

Appropriate golfing attire is required for all members and their guests, whether at the Clubhouse, practice range, learning center, or golf course. Acceptable clothing includes slacks, Bermuda shorts, golf skirts, and collared shirts (ladies may wear shirts without collars if they have sleeves). If in doubt, please err on the side of formality and conservatism.

Unacceptable clothing includes T-shirts, tank tops, men's short sleeve mock turtlenecks, numerical sports jerseys, jeans, cut-offs, blue denim garments, bicycle shorts, swimming attire, sweat suits, coaching shorts and shorts that are higher than three inches above the knee. Members and guests are expected to keep their shirts tucked in. Headgear should be worn with the bill forward.

Tennis Attire

Proper tennis attire is defined as all white. Narrow trim (on the edge of one's shirt, blouse, vest, skirt, dress, shorts, hat, or shoes) will be permitted. Shirts: Gentlemen's shirts must have collars and sleeves. T-shirts are not permitted. Shoes: All players, including children, are encouraged to wear white tennis shoes. Hats: White hats are encouraged. Warm Ups: White warm ups are encouraged. Non-tennis shoes, bathing suits, and cut-offs, and colored clothing are not permitted. Children (under the age of 16) are permitted to wear colored hats and all white t-shirts, as long as they do not have large logos.

Pace of Play

Players are expected to complete their round in 3 hours and 50 minutes or less. The Elkridge Club takes pace of play very seriously. As a visiting group you should take special care to ensure you play as quickly as possible so as not to disrupt the experience of players behind you. Groups are asked to respect all staff requests to maintain a proper pace.

Unaccompanied Guests

All requests for reciprocal/unaccompanied play must be approved through either the Head Golf Pro or General Manager. All unaccompanied golf guests are required to use a Forecaddie. The cost for a Forecaddie is \$30 per player and must be paid in cash.

Other Information

- Smoking is not permitted in any building or area under roof or with sides, including the outdoor terraces and porches.

Driving on Property

While driving onto the Elkridge Club property, please observe all signage for golfers, refrain from using your cellphone and watch for children. Please do not drive more than ten miles per hour while on Club property.

Directions

From Downtown Baltimore/PA:

- 1.(a) From Downtown: Take 83 North to Exit 10A Northern Parkway East.
- 1.(b) From PA: Take 83 South to Exit 10A Northern Parkway East.
2. Travel through two traffic lights.
3. At the third light, turn left onto Charles Street.
4. Travel through two lights (the second being Gittings Avenue) and get into the left lane. You will see two stone pillars on the left that mark the Elkridge Club entrance.
5. If you pass Stevenson Lane, you have gone too far

From Annapolis/Washington D.C./Other Points

1. Follow 95, 295, 395 or 97 to Baltimore Beltway (695) North.
2. Follow beltway north towards Towson to Exit 25 South.
3. Exit 25 is Charles Street; stay to the right.
4. Proceed south on Charles Street approximately four miles.
5. At Stevenson Lane, get into the right lane.
6. Three-tenths of a mile past Stevenson Lane, you will see two stone pillars on the right that mark the Elkridge Club entrance.
7. If you pass Gittings Avenue, you have gone too far.

From Bel Air/Wilmington/Philadelphia:

1. Follow 95 South to the Baltimore Beltway (695 West) towards Towson.
2. Take Exit 25 to Charles Street South.
3. Turn left onto Bellona Avenue, and turn left onto Charles Street (139 South).
4. Proceed south on Charles Street approximately four miles.
5. At Stevenson Lane, get into the right lane.
6. Three-tenths of a mile past Stevenson Lane, you will see two stone pillars on the right that mark the Elkridge Club entrance.
7. If you pass Gittings Avenue, you have gone too far.
